## A Good Weekend

Central Scotland Institute of Sport athletes picked up 3 titles at the Scottish National Age Group Championships. Stirling University student John Carr won the Under 20 long jump with a leap of 6.97 metres, close to his personal best and then went on to win the triple jump with a distance of 14.04 metres. Pole vaulter Kim Skinner from Stenhousemuir won the under 20 event with a clearance of 3.70 metres and is now consistently clearing highest approaching 4 metres.

In tennis 14 year old Katie Gater from Dunblane produced some fine performances to win the Scottish Senior Indoor title. Having won the semi-final against M. McKenzie of Stirling University 6-3, 6-0 she was faced with a much sterner test in the final against Aisha Kerr. Katie won the first set 6-3 but lost the second 6-4. However she came back to win the last set 7-5 in a very close fought match. Keith Meisner reached the final of the mens event, beating G Thomson of Whitecraigs 6-1, 6-2. In the final he faced title holder J. Gray of Thon Park. Keith won the first set 6-3 but succumbed in the next 2 sets 6-3, 6-4. Overall a good performance.

At the National Junior Curling Championships, Logan Gray (pictured) from Balfron and Gordon McDougall and their rink were deserved winners. They won all of their games in the round robin section and in the final beat the rink skipped by Jamie Dick, sealing victory with an impressive 5 in the seventh end. Lauren Johnston from Stirling was a member of Kerry Barr's rink which reached the girls final. However they were beaten in a very close match by Lockerbies Jennifer Morrison and her rink. The score being 9-7 as Morrison stole a stone in the last end.
